Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Evangelism is a scary word for most of us. We imagine all sorts of horrible situations when we think of that word. We imagine people with "Turn or Burn" signs; we imagine people getting up into our grills about Jesus and the Bible. We imagine, if we imagine, ourselves being ridiculed by others for sharing our faith. Some of us imagine that faith is private and should not be shared with others or, if we do believe we should share our faith, we'd rather let someone else do that work. It just simply is "for us".

Yet, in the Scripture above, sharing one's faith isn't a requirement, but an expression of our life in Jesus Christ. Let's pause and think about this, if Jesus Christ is the Savior of our souls and the Lord of our lives...if we really see that as GOOD NEWS that is FOR EVERYONE...then we have a moral duty to share the Gospel with people. We, as Christians, know THE WAY to eternal, abundant life: JESUS CHRIST.

With all of that said, it still is scary to imagine ourselves evangelizing in any way, shape, or form. That reality comes from the fact that we see evangelism as something different than relationships. When we go to a ball game and we witness an historic, hall-of-fame play, do we fail to tell our family, friends or neighbors? Of course not! We have no problem sharing all sorts of awesome good news to people, just so long as it is NOT THE SINGLE-MOST IMPORTANT MESSAGE OF GOOD NEWS in the history of Creation. So let me briefly share a true tale with you to illustrate how evangelism can be both natural and rewarding.

Once we started to open back up after being in lockdown during the pandemic, I (Pastor Todd) began to reemerge out in community again. A lot of Spring Street had stayed shut down, including what was once The Barrel House, where I would often go and hang...to get to know people. This was a regular practice of mine, as well as frequenting other places on Spring Street that have since closed, changed or moved.

As a guy who loves beer in all of its beautiful variety, I decided to go back to a place that I had not been to that much prior the pandemic: Angry Erik Brewing. A local brewery in Hampton, NJ (originally it was located in Lafayette, NJ), Angry Erik is owned by Erik and Heide, who established their business in 2014. In fact, Heide is the real genius behind their brews, having a degree in biochemistry and trained in culinary school as well.

Anyway, I started to show up at their establishment and would just sit there and interact with the tasting room attendants. By interacting, I mean that I would sit there, sip a beer, and just chit-chat. Over time, I got to know and look forward to seeing each of them. In other words, I became a regular, and through that, I also got to know the people sitting around me as they would also join in conversation.

Week after week, for two years, I would show up and talk. One great conversation starter is my tattoo sleeve...well, all of my tattoos really. In fact, two people who are now members of our church first started talking with me over my tattoos. People will often ask about them, what they mean, or some just ask to look at them, and that often sparks great conversations because each of my tattoos have significant meaning that very much ties into my faith.

In doing that, I have opened myself up to people and they have in turn opened themselves up to me. You may not realize this, but we have been visited by Angry Erik patrons in the past and, I suspect, that will continue to be the case. What's more, as mentioned above, it has resulted in two people, Anne and Scott, joining our church.

What I have been doing there and elsewhere is NOT ingenuine either. I did not attend Angy Erik's "to grow the church". I went there because I love beer and it's nice to have a "third place" (not work, not home...but a third place) to hang out in. It's fun to be a part of community. It's fun to meet new people and hear their stories. It's something that I, typically an introvert, have come to appreciate.

With that said, everything I do, I do for the glory of God and so I don't hide who I am or what I do from anyone. I am authentically me and people have gotten to know me for who I am...not just what I do. Because of that, I can share my faith and do it in a non-threatening and INVITING way that reaches people where they are. This is how I, regardless of where I am, live into the call to spread the Good News to all people.

Friends, the tale I told above is not a tall-tale. It is the truth. Evangelism is...and SHOULD BE...natural. What makes you passionate? What sparks life-giving joy in you. Go do it...but do it for the glory of God. Open yourselves up to people. Get to know them. Come to love them. In doing so, you will also find yourself spreading the Good News faithfully for the Kingdom of God. Don't believe me; shadow me and I will show you. Remember, our next Theology on Tap at Angry Erik is Thursday, September 7 at 6 p.m. If you are able, I hope to see you there.


